



Durometer is a relative hardness measure frequently used for rubber and plastic products.

There are several scales used for wheels.

The number is the rating from 0-100, with 0 being no resistance and 100 being very hard plastic.

Regardless of which scale a manufacturer uses the lower the number the more grip the wheel has.

Larger diameter means greater roll, but hard to spin on, commonly used for Dance and figures (60 to 63mm).

Freeskate wheels generally smaller are diameter to allow for spinning (55 to 57mm).
